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HOT-ICU newsletter – November 2019


Thank you very much for your steady commitment to the HOT-ICU trial.

Status

We are happy to announce that on the 24th of October two sites in Manchester, on the 6th of November Kingston Hospital and today the 8th of November Cwm Taf Royal Glam were all given the green light to enroll patients. A total of 33 sites are now participating in the trial. We expect an additional two UK sites to start up soon.

The results from the ICU-ROX trial in Australia and New Zealand were published the 14th of October in the New England Journal of Medicine (<u>link</u>). The authors found no difference in ventilator free days at day 28 in patients having mechanical ventilation when comparing a conservative oxygen strategy to usual care. In total 1000 patients were randomised. The results of this large trial has not had any consequences for the HOT-ICU trial.

Patient number 2144 out of the planned 2928 has now been included, and thereby have we included more than double of that in the ICU-ROX trial. Only 784 patients remain to be enrolled before completion of the trial. We therefor encourage all sites to stay vigilant and included all eligible patients, in order to aid the completion of the trial.
