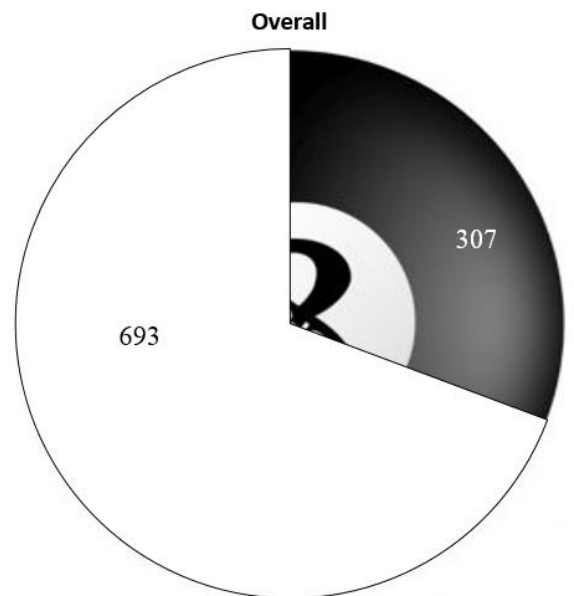
**Dear Friends! Thank you for your commitment to the AID-ICU trial!**

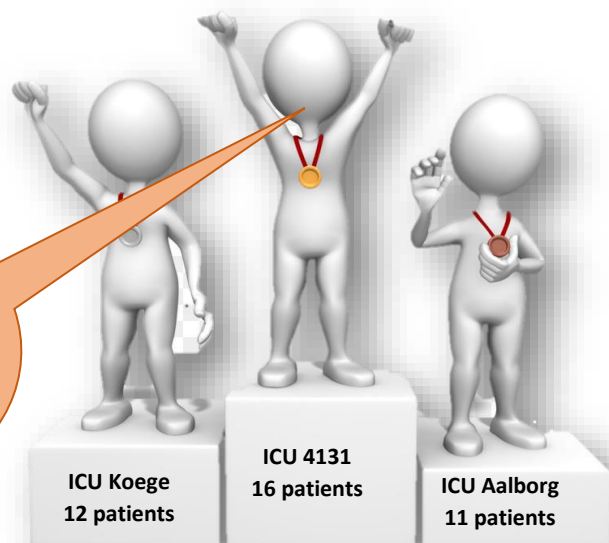

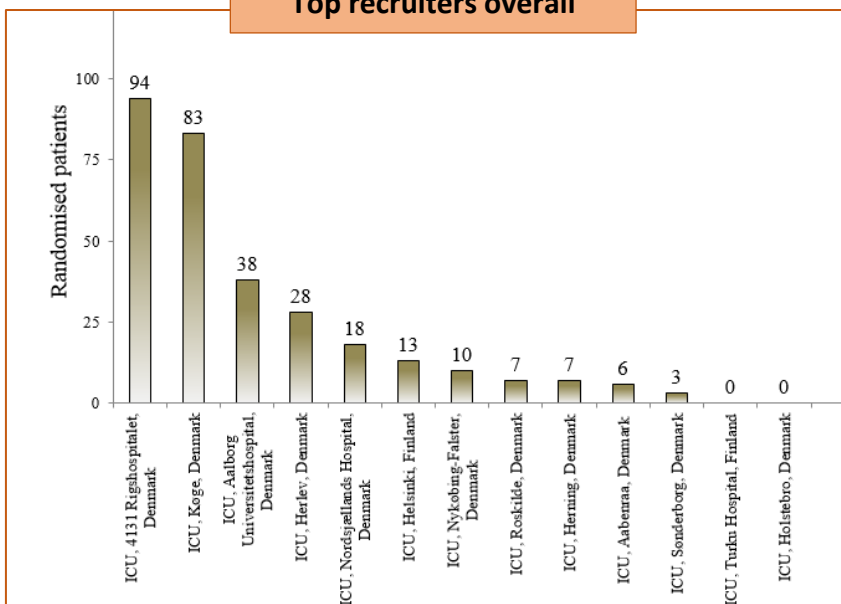
## Welcoming new sites

## Important news from the coordinating centre

1. The Danish Ethics Committee approved the AID-ICU protocol version 4.2 (protocol announced in last newsletter). Please print and archive the approval: "Godkendelse af tillægsprotokol nr. 5" in Site Master File section 4b.
2. Questions on when to report Acute Hepatic Failure have led to the development of a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) called Acute Hepatic Failure. The SOP shall ensure uniform registration of SAR and improve safety in the trial. Please print the attached document and archive in Site Master File in section 9aVI.
3. If you need an updated table of content for your Site Master File it is attached to this newsletter.

### THE AFTER AID TRIAL

Our ICU nurse Camilla Bekker Mortensen is responsible for 1 year follow-up of the AID-ICU cohort (After-AID). Since AID-ICU was initiated at Zealand University Hospital in June 2018 the After-AID trial is slowly starting to collect 1-year data on mortality, quality of life and cognitive function. The after-AID study will hopefully increase knowledge of the long-term consequences of delirium.
